## **Message from the Cabinet Secretary**

I wish to congratulate the 2016 graduands of South Eastern Kenya University. I note with gratification that this is the third graduation ceremony since the University was granted a charter on 1st March 2013. The number of graduands has increased to 823(93%) in 2016 from 427 in 2015. I am also impressed by the magnificent landmark buildings and elaborate support systems in the university that are as result of the good leadership and team work between the Chancellor, Council, and University management with the support from the government.

The important role universities play in creation of knowledge for national

development need no gainsaving. As a young nation, whose growth is hinged mainly on the development of skilled and knowledgeable and human capital base, our envisaged economic takeoff is fundamentally tied to how well we manage our education sector in general and our institutions of higher learning in particular to play their rightful role in this endeavor. In order to ensure that our education sector is fully responsive to the needs of the local and the global job markets, the Ministry is reviewing the curricula at all levels. This review aims, among other things, at ensuring that learners' potentials and unique areas of strength are identified at the right time and stage and harnessed in the best way possible.As a constitutional requirement, we shall involve all stakeholders in this review to ensure that the product of the exercise is acceptable and beneficial to all parties. I therefore appeal to the public to provide their views that would enrich our curriculum.

Finally, I urge the graduands to put the education they have acquired from this institution into proper use for the benefit of our nation and humanity at large. May God give you strength and wisdom as you embark on the next phase of your academic and professional life.
