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THE TRANSITION

The South Eastern Kenya University was established on 1st March 2013 as a successor to South Eastern University College (SEUCO). SEUCO was established on 15th July 2008 as a successor to Ukamba Agricultural Institute (UKAI)

The Ukamba Agricultural Institute (UKAI) was among Kenya's Harambee Institutes of Technology (HIT) that were established in the early 1970's in response to a felt need of the country's skilled and semi-skilled human-power in technology. In 1972, Kamba leaders started UKAI and appointed trustees and officials (who were prominent Kamba Leaders then) with Bishop R. S. Ndingi as the National President and H.E. the late President, Mzee Jomo Kenyatta, as the Patron to oversee the management of the Institute. The County Councils of the then Masaku and Kitui, as the sponsoring Districts, donated land for the purposes of the Institute's objectives. The construction materials and financial resources were provided by members of the Kamba community.

The Institute was registered, initially as an unaided School, under the Ministry of Education in March 1976. Throughout the 1980s and 1990s, UKAI had many problems related to the governance and management of the Institute. The Institute officially closed in the year 2000 and

re-opened in October 2004 under the management of a new Board of Governors which was appointed by the Minister of Education and inaugurated on 14th July 2005. The new Board of governors was chaired by Prof. Raphael Munavu who later became the 1st Chairman of Council of the University College.

South Eastern Kenya University gets a Charter

The South Eastern Kenya University (SEKU) acquired the status of a fully-fledged Public University after being awarded its Charter on 1st March 2013.





South Eastern Kenya University Inaugurates her 1st Chancellor

The historic Mass Charter Award Ceremony, which was presided over by the immediate former President, H.E. Hon. Mwai Kibaki, saw five University Colleges and two Private Universities being awarded Charters and seven existing Public Universities awarded Charters to conform to the recently enforced Universities Act No.42 of 2012. The Universities also received their Accreditation reports and other Instruments of Authority (Mace, Logo and Seal) during the award ceremony.

The new Universities Act repealed the seven Acts of Parliament that the existing seven Public Universities were individually operating under, consequently bringing all universities both public and private under the authority of the new law.

The Chairman of the Commission for University Education, Prof. Ezra Maritim, said that the bringing together of Private and Public Universities as spelt out in the Universities Act of 2012, should not be viewed as a merger of two competing forces but as a consolidation of strengths that will steer university education to meet the national needs and enhance our country's regional competitiveness.



The University is endowed with land resources located in strategic areas in different parts of the country. Once these facilities are well developed, SEKU will emerge as one of the largest and best university in this region.



Finally, on behalf of the University Council, I would once again like to congratulate the pioneer graduands of this university for work well done and for having completed their studies in this University successfully.



SCHOOL OF AGRICULTURE AND VETERINARY SCIENCE



INTRODUCTION

This is one of the main Schools in the South Eastern Kenya University (SEKU) in that at its inception, Dryland Agriculture and Veterinary Science formed the core mandate of this new University. The emphasis was on the management of the Arid and Semi Arid lands (ASALS) of Kenya, to meet both educational and food requirements of ASAL inhabitants. One of the core mandates of the School is to promote dryland crop production. Emphasis is laid on drought tolerant crops such as sorghum, millets, pigeon peas, green grams, chickpea, cowpea, maize and beans. This is with a view to assuring food sufficiency.

The ASALS harbor 50% of total livestock population. Over 30% of the Kenyan population derive their livelihoods forum the livestock industry and the sector contributes between 10-15 of the natural GDP. The School emphasis on veterinary which is hoped to augment livestock production in the ASAL. It also promotes management and utilization of free range by wildlife as a complement to domestic livestock production under extensive livestock production.

OBJECTIVES

The objective and goal of this school is to train graduates in diverse areas of specialization ranging from Dryland Agriculture, Dryland Animal Sciences, Agricultural Economics and Food Science and Technology. The school emphasizes handson training to ensure that graduates have both the art and science of dryland management and production. In this case all the graduates are exposed to the dryland production environment through extensive tours and visits to the typical dryland regions of this country namely the Northern and Southern rangelands.

The very early acclimatization of the young graduates to their future environment endears them to the so called hardship districts which were otherwise given less emphasis. The ultimate thrust is to double the gains from the dry lands through government investment coupled with trained manpower and financial resources to ensure production and sustainable management of the arid and semi-arid lands.


Graduate Employment Opportunities


After signing the university performance contracts, they are further cascaded down to individual schools, divisions, directorates, departments, sections and units.





MTITO ANDEI CAMPUS OVERVIEW OF THE CAMPUS



The premises upon which the South Eastern Kenya University (SEKU), Mtito-Andei Campus sits was constructed with funds from the Ministry of Education under the Economic Stimulus Project as a Centre of Excellence. It was officially handed over to SEKU by the Minister of Education on 9th November 2012. The facility comprises of: Administration Block, Four (4) Lecture Halls, Library, Dining Hall, Hostel, Laboratory, Guest house, and three (3) Ablution blocks.

LOCATION

Mtito-Andei Campus is located in Nthongoni Location, Mtito-Andei Division, Kibwezi District, Makueni County. It is about 5 Kilometers west of the historical Mtito-Andei Town along Nairobi-Mombasa Highway. The campus lies on 20 acres of land in a serene environment conducive for learning. Its immediate tourist attraction sites and natural features include Chyulu Hills and Chyulu National Park to the west, Yatta Plateau and River Athi to the east, while Tsavo East and Tsavo West National Parks lie to the south. Fulltime/Weekdays: Mondays to Fridays (8.00 a.m. – 5.00p.m).


Part-Time/Evenings: Mondays to Fridays (5.30 p.m. – 8.30 p.m.) plus all Saturdays.

Public Private Partnership

Public Private Partnership (PPP) is an institutional relationship between a government entity (the University) and one or more private sector investors for the purposes of offering a service or project. In this case the investor assumes substantial, technical, operational and capital investment of the project for a contracted period. In its part, the University will provide land and handle the legal and regulatory framework needed to establish PPP projects.

With this understanding, and in line with the University's development objectives stated in themaster plan, we have identified priority areas in which we can engage development partners to address critical challenges facing the University. Key among these is the need to expand student accommodation facilities on campus as outlined in our strategic plan, and deviate from peggingstudent enrolments to bed capacity.

To this end, the Kenya government, under section 7(d) of the Public Private Partnership Act 2013 has approved our proposal to develop student hostels under a PPP arrangement. On the basis of this approval, the University is equipped to engage in dialogue with Development Partners and other parties willing to enter into collaboration for the objective of developing student hostels on campus.

It is envisaged that the University's PPP arrangement will be expanded to include other critical success areas suchas the development of staff housing and select academic facilities. We believe that the PPP arrangement will play an important role in our endeavour to expand University education in the South Eastern region and the country at large.

Details of the PPP arrangement may be obtained from the Registrar, Planning and Development at the main Campus located in Kwavonza area of Kitui County.




